

Talking about the return of Jesus to this planet, and looking forward to his coming, there are many passages of Scripture that speak of His Second Coming. Here are a few:

“First of all, you must understand that in the last days scoffers will come, scoffing and following their own evil desires. They will say, ‘Where is this “coming” He promised? Ever since our fathers died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation.’ But they deliberately forget that long ago by God’s Word the heavens existed and the earth was formed out of water and by water. By these waters also the world of that time was deluged and destroyed. By the same Word the present heavens and earth are reserved for fire, being kept for the Day of Judgment and destruction of ungodly men.

“But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping His promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare. Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. But in keeping with His promise we are looking forward to a new

heaven and a new earth, the home of righteousness. So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with Him” (2 Peter 3:3-14).

“...as you look forward to the day of God...” Are you looking forward to the return of Jesus? I think a lot of Christians are afraid to say “no” to that question. They instinctively know that the answer should be “yes...of course I’m looking forward to His return.” But in our heart of hearts...is that really so? Are we longing for His return?

All too often it seems that we have made our home here on this planet, and heaven is sort of a safety net to catch us when we die. Occasionally, the death of a loved one wrenches our sight off of the affairs of this world long enough to remember that there is a heaven. Most of the time, however, we find ourselves firmly ensconced in the daily matters of this life.

Some would ask, “What’s the problem with that? Do you want us to be so heavenly-minded that we are of no earthly good?” The problem is that the New Testament Church seemed to be far more focused on the return of Jesus than the Church today. And that focus served them well. It gave them a passion and urgency so that within a generation it was said of them, “They have turned the world upside down.”

The emphasis on the Lord’s return is not for the purpose of speculation concerning dates or developing systems of what

His return will be like. Those matters can be interesting, but can become distractions if we are not careful. Divisions that grieve the Lord can arise over various viewpoints.

The Apostle Peter instead gives us a clear, balanced picture of how a proper emphasis on the return of Jesus can impact the Church. It is first of all a matter of looking forward to His return. If repetition is a way of making a point, Peter hammers home the matter of looking forward to the Second Coming:

1. “as you look forward” – 2 Pet. 3:12
2. “we are looking forward” – 2 Pet. 3:13
3. “since you are looking forward to this” – 2 Pet. 3:14

This emphasis on looking forward to the return of Jesus is to have a practical impact on the character and lifestyle of the Christian. Peter asks the question, “What kind of people ought you to be?” and then answers: “You ought to live holy and godly lives... as you look forward to the day of God” (vv.11-12). In verse 14 he phrases it differently, but with the same result: “...since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with Him.” Could it be that we do not look forward to Christ’s coming because we do not want to change our lifestyles?

There is one other lifestyle change that is encouraged by looking forward to the Second Coming. As we begin to realize that this

world is temporary, we find ourselves more urgently involved in completing the task of world evangelization. Whether it is in sharing our faith with a neighbor or in giving financially to fund a missionary, we will throw ourselves wholeheartedly into this as a result of a life of expectancy.

Throughout our passage, we see the Lord’s concern for the lost. In 2 Peter 3:9 it is pointed out that He does not want anyone to perish, but desires them to come to repentance. Verse 12 includes the fascinating admonition that we may help speed the coming of the day of God. Most scholars believe that this means making sure we are involved in finishing the task of world evangelization. It fits well with Matthew 24:14, “And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come.”

William Carey said, “If you want the Kingdom speeded, go out and speed it yourselves. Only obedience rationalizes prayer. Only Missions can redeem your intercessions from insincerity.” Andrew Murray stated, “There is need of a great revival of spiritual life, of truly fervent devotion to our Lord Jesus, of entire consecration to His service. It is only in a church in which this spirit of revival has at least begun, that there is any hope of radical change in the relation of the majority of our Christian people to mission work..”

Yes, it’s a good reminder for us that how much of oil we have in reserve for our lives to keep the light burning and to shine in this world of darkness.

As we prepare ourselves to face the realities of life in the family and in the ministry this new year “2021”, lets us not neglect our preparedness in the light of the reality of the glorious Second Coming of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

In the midst of our effort in serving the servants of God, let us run the race with perseverance and confidence and be prepared to meet the King of kings and the Lord of lords any moment when the cry is heard: ‘Behold, the bridegroom is coming; go out to meet him!’.

Blessed to Bless

“Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.” – Psalm 37:4

Introduction:

“Blessed to Bless Scheme” (MUT Scheme) is an entry scheme to all Schemes of MUT, In this scheme 157 Mission organizations with 1,5370 members join together upholding their co-member missionaries in the bereavement, sickness, and crisis. Each member contributes Rs.50/- and the Mission contributes an equal amount. This amount (Rs 100) given by the member missionaries is shared by LYB, IMPACT, and GS Schemes for the needy members in the area of Medical, Calamity, Crisis Relief, and Retired Missionaries Welfare. The Support Schemes (SS) are further funded by the donations received from Friends of MUT(FOM). Workers of Registered Christian missions focusing on evangelism and discipleship, with a monthly salary less than Rs.20000/- and aged between 18 and 65 years are eligible. This is not an Insurance Scheme.

Objectives:

1. To facilitate care and provide financial assistance to medical needs, Calamity Relief & Crisis Relief to the family of a member.
2. To encourage the spirit of mutual concern among missionary/ Christian workers from various Mission organizations and enable the Missionary/Christian worker Community to help one another in need.
3. To provide a common platform by mobilizing prayer support and comforting communications within the Missionary Fraternity for the member families in the Blessed to Bless Scheme (MUT Scheme).

Mission organizations are the vital links between MUT and their missionaries in providing care.

A total of Rs. 59,95,695.28/- given (August to November 2020) by the member missionaries to assist the Beloved families, missionaries with various health challenges, and the missionaries faced with an unexpected crisis.

We request you to kindly continue to uphold us as we facilitate the missionary care among member mission organizations. It is encouraging to see the way member missionaries are partnering in the missionary care in caring for another missionary who is in need.

Good Samaritan Fund

The GSF Scheme helps the missionaries in meeting the following unmet needs, during crises in their life and the life of their extended family members. The mission leader has been authorized to extend support to the missionary during the following crises and can claim reimbursement from MUT by forwarding the GSFund application along with the necessary documents.

1. Travel assistance to missionaries and their family to attend the funeral of their parents by Flight/Train/Bus. (Only for Onward Journey)
2. Travel assistance to the missionaries to visit their parents during their serious sickness. (one time only)
3. Travel assistance for missionary children to attend the funeral of their parents and to visit their parents when they are seriously sick (one time only)
4. Funeral expenses of dependent parents and dependent children.
5. A small assistance to meet the Major Medical expenses of their dependent parents.
6. Missionaries' daughter's first delivery expenses (Only for two daughters)
7. Assistance at the time of natural calamities, theft, and persecution.

During the four months from August to November 2020, 159 missionaries have been assisted from GSFund to the tune of Rs. 9,09,360/- to overcome various crisis. This includes assistance to fifty-five missionaries whose houses have been damaged due to flooding of the Brahmaputra River. The total amount of assistance is Rs. 1,84,000/-

15 First Generation Christian missionaries have been assisted with Rs. 7,000/- each during their marriage from General Crisis Fund. This assistance helps them to overcome their financial struggles to some extent at the time of their marriage. Similarly, Rs. 10,000/- was extended to 35 first-generation Christian missionaries for their children's marriage, from the M Kids welfare scheme.

Assistance for treatment of Covid-19 infected missionaries has been provided to 14 missionaries during these four months to the tune of Rs. 1.77 lakh.

Please do partner with us in praying and supporting the missionaries and uphold them during their time of crisis.

Retired Missionary Welfare

We look up to the Lord, with a grateful heart for His love and provision towards meeting some of the unmet needs of the retired missionaries, in the physical (medical & financial), Emotional and spiritual areas. As of 1st Dec 2020, there are 718 retired missionaries from 56 missions.

The highlight of this lockdown period was conducting 6 half-day zoom fellowship meets for the retired missionaries, from the third week of September to the second week of November. I thank God for the prayerful and encouraging RMW Core Committee members and the RMW team, which made this fellowship meets a great blessing. We held two meets in Tamil for the RMs settled in TN, one in English for those in Kerala and Karnataka, one in Hindi for those in North India, one in Oriya, and one in Telugu. God provided us with Godly resource persons to share the devotions, messages and to conduct worship in the respective languages. All were spiritually revived. I thank God for the five doctors, who could give medical tips to the retired missionaries,

in their respective languages. As a team, we were able to contact nearly 550 RMs, during this period, and encourage them. Nearly 250 families attended the retreats and were blessed.

During these 4 months, 67 RMs of 19 missions were assisted up to Rs.4.54 lakh, to meet the cost of regular medicines, hospitalizations, and funeral expenses of the spouse. Eleven RMs of 7 missions, were provided with Affordable Cost (Generic) Medicines. God enabled us to provide Glucometers and strips to 16 RMs from 9 missions on Insulin. Thanks to the thoughtful generosity of a friend of MUT.

We want to praise God for each one of you who supported the needs of the retired missionaries, generously and consistently. We earnestly beseech your prayer support.

Health Care

Even though providing the Medical needs of missionaries is identified as one of the objectives from the inception it has not stopped with only the provision of finances. The Medical Team has been identifying how best to serve the missionaries who are going through health challenges. The same is done through various Interventions.

We as MUT want to provide as much information as possible to the Mission fraternity at large as regards the COVID 19 Pandemic.

1. Initially few videos were sent in English, Hindi and Tamil developed by WHO as well as by CMCH with their permission to all missions. The videos comprised of awareness, precautions, and what to do if someone is affected.
2. Introduction of Tele Medicine facility during lockdown for missionaries from all over the country was added keeping pace with the changing scenario of Lockdown. A 24x7 helpline with 60+ mission-minded doctors has started functioning. Through this facility, more than 50+ missionaries were connected and consultation by different doctors was done through phone and video conference.
3. The COVID Suraksha Course introduced by the CMC Distance education department was sent to all Missions to encourage their staff to do the same. The actual cost of the course is Rs.1000/- but for missionaries, it is made free of cost.
4. We found that there were missionaries taking insulin for

years and were unable to do blood check-ups during the lockdown. A study was conducted and this need was met through a donation received from a well-wisher providing Glucometer

5. Master Health Check-up (MHC): All missions are requested to have MHC after the pandemic is over. MUT medical team is in the process of encouraging missions to conduct MHC for their missionaries. The purpose is that every missionary is made comfortable to serve the Lord in the best possible way. Despite the impact of lockdowns with some relaxations 13 missionaries from two organisations underwent MHC in different places.

Affordable Cost Medicine: The same was provided to 75 missionaries from 30 Organisations with medicines for Diabetics, hypertension, & Cholesterol.

Medical Assistance: From August to November'20, 409 Missionaries from 79 Organisations received Medical financial assistance.



Deepa Jebakumar and Neyveli team members along with Sam Paul organized a retreat Youth Encounter - Run To Get from October 24th to 26th 2020 through online daily from 5 to 7 PM. There were group discussions, motivational talk and testimonies. Mr and Mrs Saravanan Paul, Mr. Joshua and Mr. Duke Jeyaraj ministered to them. This time there was wider participation of students from all over the country. About 40

students participated. It was a great blessing to all those who have attended. Attending online classes is one of the main challenge they all face during this pandemic time. Kindly uphold all the missionary children in your prayers. Financial assistance for missionary children who are doing undergraduate studies as well as for the needy 1st generation missionary children's marriage is continuing.

Take Time To Wait On God

Here is a common perplexity. Every Christian sees around him sorrow and suffering which he cannot help, and his perplexity at the sight is the Lord's prompting for him to take the very uttermost care of his own soul lest he stumble and fall through doubt and discouragement.

By the care of his soul it does not mean that he shall coddle and pet and pity himself, nor work himself up into some pleasant feeling. It means that he should pray and pray and pray, and seek the presence and teaching of the Holy Spirit until his soul is filled with light and strength, that he may have unquestioning faith in the wisdom and love of God, that he may have unwearied patience in learning His will (Heb. 6:12), and that his love may be equal to the great need he sees all about him.

Reader, maybe you, too, are troubled by the sight of unhelped sin and suffering near you. No living soul can answer to your satisfaction the questions that will rise up within you, and that Satan will suggest as you look on the misery of the world. But the blessed Comforter will satisfy your heart and your head if you have the faith and patience to wait while He teaches you "all things" and leads you "into all truth" (John 16:13).

"They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength" (Isa. 40:31). You cannot help people if you go to them robbed of your strength through doubts and fears and perplexities. So wait on God till He strengthens your heart.

Do not become impatient. Do not try beforehand to find out what God will say, nor just how He will say it. He will surely teach you, but you must let Him do it in His own way, and then you will be able to help people with all the might and wisdom of Jehovah.

You must trust His love and you must abide His time, but you must wait on Him and expect Him to teach you. If the King of England is coming to Windsor Castle, the servants do not lie

around listlessly nor hunt up a lot of work to do, but every one stands in his own place and waits with eager expectancy. This is what I mean by waiting upon God. Of this kind of taking care of your own soul you cannot do too much, and do not let anyone drive you from it by ridicule or entreaty.

The woodman would be very foolish who thought he had so much wood to cut that he could not take time to grind his axe. The servant would be useless who went to the city to buy things for his master, but was in such a hurry that he did not come to his master for orders and the needed money. How much worse is he who attempts to do God's work without God's direction and God's strength!

People who do not find God in prayer must hinder His cause instead of helping it. Take time! Miss breakfast if necessary, but take time to wait on God, and when God has come and blessed you, then go to the miserable ones about you and pour upon them the wealth of joy, the love and peace God has given you. But do not go until you know you are going in His power.

Paul said, "Take heed therefore [1] unto yourselves, and [2] to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers" (Acts 20:28). And again, "Take heed [1] unto thyself, and [2] to the doctrine...for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee" (1 Tim. 4:16).

Paul did not mean to promote selfishness by telling us to first take heed to ourselves, but he did mean to teach that unless we do take heed to ourselves and are full of faith and hope and love in our own souls we shall be unable to help others.

Rest House

The Rest House in Vellore was closed until the end of October, except for Cancer patients on treatment who continued to stay. During this time the Rest House maintenance work was taken up and rectifications are done. Items requiring replacement were also taken up and is being raised. Thanks to the ones who are donating items for Otteri and Gandhi Nagar Rest Houses.

From 1st of November, the Rest Houses in Vellore at 50% capacity keeping in mind the distancing to be maintained for those suffering from Major illnesses like Cancer, Transplant, Open heart surgery, Dialysis, and a Brain tumour.

The 3 room Rest House in Virthumpet under Gandhi Nagar Resthouse is kept to isolate missionaries if they are tested positive during treatment. All precaution is taken to see that the Rest Houses are sanitised and missionaries follow the protocol laid down during the pandemic.

Rest House in Chennai: Mostly used as transit by missionaries. Praying for God to provide a place with more rooms. During COVID missionaries on transit weren't there.

Rest House in Coimbatore: It is used for missionaries who come for a break along with their children for vacation, but because of COVID not utilised.

Rest House in Mumbai: One missionary on cancer treatment continues to stay and visits Bethany hospital in Mumbai.

Rest House in Bangalore: A room of Mr. Malcolm's residence is used as a Rest House.

Rest House in Puducherry: Used by missionaries who come for treatment to JIPMER. The volunteer team takes care of the same.

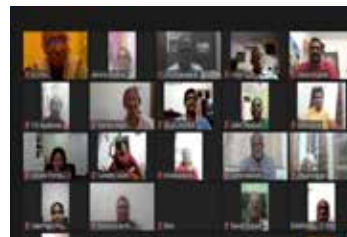
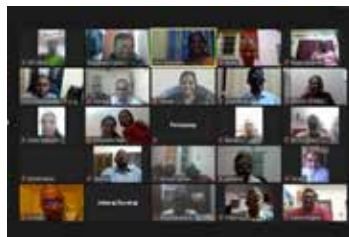
Vision Casting

MUT was a spin off from MUF (Missionaries Upholder Family) in the year 1993. The role of MUT is to care for missionaries by

meeting some of the common unmet needs at a cost affordable to them in physical, emotional and spiritual areas, with a view to equip, energise and to motivate them, to build the kingdom of God effectively.

MUT is an umbrella body covering over 254 Organizations as member missions covering about 22,317 missionaries and christian workers. MUT is governed by a Board of Trustees and managed by the General Coordinator assisted mostly by over 60 volunteers; recently some of the Member Missions have taken keen interest in the ministry and are giving their committed workers on deputation for a period from 6 months to 2 years. There are over 37 people on MUT payroll, receiving monthly remuneration. The operational costs and administrative expenses are kept low through sponsorship and donations towards administrative expenses. MUT does not append any money from any of its earmarked donations received.

Finance Policy

Ear-marked funds will be used exclusively and entirely for the purpose donated.

Operating cost is kept to the minimum and funds donated towards MUT general expenses is utilised for the same.

Sponsorships are sought and fund-raising events are held to meet other specific expenses.

We welcome all those who wish to join in encouraging the missionaries and the Christian Workers, in their efforts to build the Kingdom of God, to partner with MUT in praying for them and the ministry of MUT. Those who are in ministry, a Church, a mission organisation or a follower of Christ with a passion for missions, may volunteer your services in different ways, as the Lord leads you.

IMPACT

This Scheme was introduced in 1997 to help families of Christian workers in times of death of a member missionary. The objective of this scheme is to provide Calamity Relief & sustained support to the family of a deceased member missionary. The bereaved family is assured of prayer support from fellow Christian workers and Friends of MUT. There are 570 bereaved missionary families till now from the inception of this scheme with whom we try to maintain contact.

In the event of the death of a member financial relief and assistance will be extended as follows:

1. On the death of a member-missionary, his spouse (or children) will be paid the death relief payment of Rs. 1,25,000/- from the member contribution.
2. The family of the deceased missionary shall also be paid Rs.10,000/- as immediate cash help from the IMPACT Support scheme.

This year due to lockdown online retreat was conducted batch-wise for women, men, youth, and children. This retreat was very fruitful for the participants who attended and they were renewed spiritually and emotionally

Education Child Support

During this year child support was given to 226 children from 131 beloved missionary families. The total expenditure was Rs. 2,71,200/-.

COVID 19 Support to bereaved families

During April 2020, we contacted as many bereaved missionary families as possible over the phone to encourage them and also to extend emergency help to those in need during the 'lockdown' period. During April 2020, 54 families were identified and Rs 1000/- was paid to each of these families through bank transfer. Again during the months of May-June 2020 help was extended to 258 families (including the 54 families already identified) by paying Rs.1,000/- to each family. The payments were made by raising special donations from those who are burdened to help these families during this critical period.

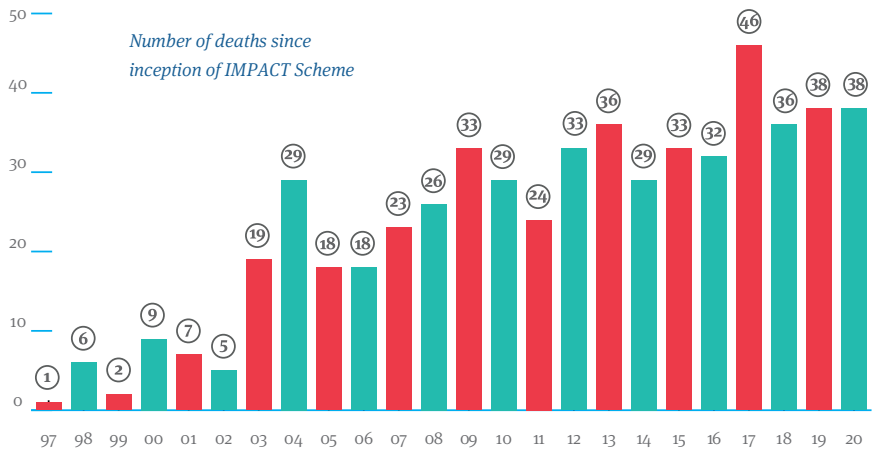
