

Becoming Mighty in Prayer

Prevailing prayer only prevails through the prevailing Spirit. It is not a work of man, even of the holiest men and women of God. It is the work of the Holy Spirit in you and through your cooperation. Samuel Chadwick confessed, "The biggest thing God ever did for me was to teach me to pray in the Spirit." No one ever becomes a man or woman of prayer except through the Holy Spirit.

How can you prepare His way so the Spirit can intercede in prevailing prayer through your being? Remember, you will always recognize that you are far too weak in prayer to prevail. Rejoice! "The Spirit helps us in our weakness" (Rom. 8:26). Again and again you will need to confess with Paul, "Lord, I do not know how to pray as I ought. I do not know precisely what all the details are for which I should prevail." Rejoice! The Spirit Himself intercedes for you with groans too deep for you ever to be able to express (v. 26).

Since the Holy Spirit is that burdened to help you pray and to prevail through you, God is far more desirous of your prevailing than you ever realized. The Spirit groans for you to become mighty in prevailing prayer. He has infinitely many groanings that are humanly inexpressible – for you to become mighty in prevailing prayer for the many significant needs in the lives of others.

The Spirit wants to make you mighty to prevail for them. God has no other way. He has ordained to bring His will to pass through your prevailing, joined to the prevailing intercession of both God the Son on heaven's throne of grace and God the Spirit. The Spirit longs to possess you more and more fully that He may pray through you more and more prevailingly.

God understands your heartbroken confession, even as Paul confessed that he did not know how to pray as he ought (Rom. 8:26). At the end of yourself, give yourself again to God in total dependence. Can you confess with Oswald J. Smith, "Ah, that burden, that burden for souls – how it has characterized God's anointed ones all down the centuries!...a host of...mighty wrestlers with God. Theirs, my brethren, is the experience I crave above all other."

God desires you to help mediate the light of the Gospel and the saving power of Jesus through your prayer. In redemption there is only one Mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus (1 Tim. 2:5). But God needs thousands of cooperating intercessory mediators today. By your prevailing prayer, place one hand on the throne of grace and the other on the need of the world. Moses did. Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Daniel did. Will you? Luther did. Wesley and Whitefield did. Finney, Brainerd, and Hyde did. Will you?

Get the Vision

First, get the vision. Ask the Spirit to let you see the world's people and their need with the loving eyes of God. Then you will understand why Nehemiah wept, why Isaiah, Jeremiah, Paul and a host of others wept. Then you will understand why Jesus wept. Ask the Spirit to let your heart feel earth's pain as the heart of God feels it. Then you will weep. Your heart will weep, and if you prevail long enough, your eyes may also fill with tears.

Next, plead the Spirit's help. Your strongest praying without the Spirit's empowering is impotent. Your feeblest words, empowered by the Spirit, can move Omnipotence. It is



not for you to see how much you can do for God. It is for you to see how much more of God you can get into your praying. It is God the Spirit who makes the difference.

Be filled with the Spirit. If you have never received the Spirit's fullness, receive it today. Clear away any controversy, any veil between your soul and God. Obey God in every step you know to take. Present yourself totally, utterly, eternally to God in absolute surrender, asking the Spirit to fill you. Do not hurry. Be thorough; make sure your surrender is real and total. Then in simple faith appropriate what God has promised: "If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!" (Luke 11:13).

Now keep filled. Purity can be preserved by the Spirit's help, but power must be renewed. If you wait on God, your strength will be renewed (Isa. 40:31). In Acts the believers were filled and refilled with the Holy Spirit.

As you drive your car, you do not need to get your car repaired every hundred miles or so. But you do need to refill it with the fuel that gives you power. A holy soul often senses spiritual depletion right in the midst of loving service to God and others. We live in a world whose environment depletes us. We war a spiritual warfare that depletes us.

Go alone with God. Ask God. Wait on God. He will refill you again and again. You must stay filled with the Spirit to pray in the Spirit. You must wait on God if you would be refilled. You must feast on His words, chapter after chapter, if you would be refilled. Remember Torrey's words, "The whole secret of prayer is found in those words, 'in the Spirit.'"

In His last teaching before the cross, Jesus revealed to us, His followers, that praying was to take a whole new dimension of power through praying in His name, through His words abiding in us, and through the help of the Holy Spirit. Are Jesus' words true of your prayer life? They can be. By God's grace, they must be. By your setting your soul's determination, through spiritual discipline and habits of prevailing intercession they will be.

Prayer power is not something worked up. It is not loudness of voice or physical or emotional self-assertion. It is power of the Spirit within your spirit. Can you paraphrase Paul's words and say, "To this end I pray, struggling with all His energy, which so powerfully works in me" (Col. 1:29)? He will work mightily in you as He prays mightily through you. He will burn the "ought" of

prevailing prayer in your innermost soul. He will give you a holy "must" that drives you to your knees.

In this restless, busy age most of us have never learned to give God time in prayer. We would rather work for God than pray. We would rather attend another service than pray. We would rather watch TV than pray. May God forgive us! Bishop J. C. Ryle confessed, "We spend our spiritual strength and forget to renew it. We multiply engagements and curtail prayer.... We work when we ought to pray, because to an active mind work is far easier than prayer.... The servant whom the Holy Spirit is to use must resist the tyranny of overwork. He must resolve to be alone with God even if the hours spent with Him appear to rob his fellow men of his service."

But, you protest, so often my heart seems cold and prayerless. R. A. Torrey testified, "Many of the most blessed seasons of prayer I have ever known have begun with the feeling of utter deadness and prayerlessness; but in my helplessness and coldness I have cast myself upon God, and looked to Him to send His Holy Spirit to teach me to pray, and He has done it."

Beloved Andrew Murray wrote, "Heaven is still as full of spiritual blessings.... God still delights to give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him. Our life and work are still as dependent on the direct impartation of the divine power as they were in Pentecostal times. Prayer is still the appointed means for drawing down these heavenly blessings in power upon ourselves and those around us. God still seeks for men and women who will, with all their other work of ministering, specially give themselves to persevering prayer."

Inter Mission Plan of Assurance on Calamity Times

IMPACT

This Scheme was introduced in 1997 to help families of Christian workers in times of death of a member missionary. The objective of this scheme is to provide Calamity Relief & sustained support to the family of a deceased Member missionary. The bereaved family is assured of prayer support from fellow Christian workers and Friends of MUT. There are 667 bereaved missionary families till now from the inception of this scheme with whom we try to maintain contact.

In the event of death of a member financial relief and assistance will be extended as follows:

1. On death of a member-missionary, his spouse (or children) will be paid the death relief payment of Rs. 14,00,00/- from the member contribution from January 2021.
2. The family of the deceased missionary shall also be paid Rs.10,000/- as immediate cash help from the IMPACT Support scheme.
3. Christmas gift of Rs1200/- per family + 200 per child is assisted in the month of December from support scheme
4. Children's allowance of Rs 1,200/-per child/p.a is assisted in the month of June from support scheme
5. Financial Assistance for higher education of Rs.15,000/- maximum/ per year is assisted for per child form the support scheme.

Spiritual Enhancement:

The beloved missionary families are encouraged spiritually and emotionally by special retreats held by the friends of MUT periodically.

A Christmas get together was held at Oddanchatram from 26th December 2021 to 29th December 2021, 15 beloved missionary families participated and had a meaningful and joyful Christmas. This retreat was very fruitful for the participants who attended. They were encouraged, renewed spiritually and emotionally and returned with a renewed Spirit as an eagle.

Christmas Gift to the Beloved Missionary families:

We provided a Christmas gift of Rs. 1200 to each of the 456 beloved families. Dependent children in these families were given Rs. 200/- per child in addition, totaling 319 children. The total expenditure was Rs. 6,11,000/-

Blessed to Bless

Introduction:

“Blessed to Bless Scheme” (MUT Scheme) is an entry scheme to all Schemes of MUT, In this scheme member mission organizations join together upholding their co-member missionaries in the bereavement, sickness, and crisis. This is not an Insurance Scheme.

Mission organizations are the vital links between MUT and their missionaries in providing care.

Membership details:

A total of 159 missions with 15,736 missionaries are enrolled in Blessed to Bless Scheme.

Contribution details:

The member missionary fraternity sacrificially contributes a total of Rs. 57,21,400/- from October 2021 to January 2022 to assist the Beloved families, missionaries with various health challenges, and the missionaries faced with an unexpected crisis. It is a God given opportunity to help another missionary family going

through very difficult times. But apart from this, partners of MUT and well-wishers of missionaries extend financial help through support schemes.

General updates:

Blessed to Bless scheme Admin committee meeting was held in the month of January 2022 to bless the missionaries in better way.

We request you to kindly continue to uphold us as we facilitate missionary care among member mission organizations. It is very affirmative to see the way member missionaries are collaborating in the missionary care in caring for other missionaries who are in need.

Vellore Rest Houses

Rest House truly is a “home away from home”. When a missionary thinks of taking a break, the first thing that comes to their mind is whether MUT has a rest house in that place. Rest houses are answers to the prayers of many missionaries. It is also a place of comfort for God’s servants who are on long treatment.

During the period October’21 to January’22, Rest Houses at Otteri and Gandhi Nagar are mostly given to missionaries who came for major illnesses like Cancer, Transplant, Open heart surgery, Dialysis and Brain tumor at 50% capacity as per the protocol laid down during the pandemic, keeping in mind the distance to be maintained.

In Otteri Rest house we had 54 missionaries from 17 Organizations at 50% capacity stayed and took treatment for major health issues in the above mentioned period. MUT

volunteer Doctor Beulah Alex and Rest house caregivers visited the missionaries and prayed for their physical, spiritual and emotional needs.

In “Mano Selvapandian Memorial Home” [Gandhi Nagar RH] & Ebenezer Home we had 39 missionaries from 15 Organizations, 5 SMILE members and 5 Independents pastors stayed and took treatment.

By God’s grace Rest House care givers are keeping in good health and have taken the two doses of corona vaccination.

Thank God for the donors who willingly donated meeting tables, ceiling fan, used Air cooler, fridge whirlpool AC and water heater. In Otteri rest house, there are few more needs to be met. Please pray for the same.

Good Samaritan Fund

The GSF Scheme helps the missionaries in meeting some common unmet needs during crisis situations. The crisis situations may be in their life or in the life of their extended family members.

1. Travel assistance to missionary and their family to attend the funeral of their parents by Flight/Train/Bus. (Only for Onward Journey)
2. Travel assistance to the missionary to visit their parents during their serious sickness. (Once only)
3. Travel assistance for missionary children to attend the funeral of their parents and to visit their parents when they are seriously sick (Once only)
4. Funeral expenses of dependent parents and dependent children.
5. Assistance up to Rs. 20,000/- to meet the medical expenses of their dependent parents in case of 21 major illnesses / Operations.
6. Missionaries' daughter's first delivery expenses (Only for two daughters)

7. Assistance at the time of Natural calamities, Theft and Persecution.

During the four-months period from 01.10.2021 to 31.01.2022, 62 missionaries have been assisted from GS Fund to the tune of Rs. 5,27,062/- in order to overcome crises. First Generation Christian missionaries have been assisted at the rate of Rs 7,000/- during their marriage from General Crisis Fund. This assistance helps them to overcome their financial struggle to some extent at the time of their marriage. During the last four months eight missionaries have been assisted. In addition, marriage gift of Rs. 10,000/- is extended for the wedding of first-generation Christian missionary children. Seven missionaries have been assisted through Mkids welfare scheme.

Covid Relief:

Covid Medical Treatment support has been extended to more than 79 missionaries to the tune of Rs.23.41 lakh during the last four months. Death Relief has been extended to the tune of Rs.9.20 lakh to four member missionaries and three pastors who died. Please do pray and partner with us in upholding the missionaries during their time of crisis.

MKids

Retreat:

As reported earlier, a retreat "Youth Encounter" for the M-kids was conducted from November 4th to 6th 2021 and about 45 children from all over India participated. It was held in bilingual English & Hindi. The theme was "Opportunity". The topics covered are Who am I? Salvation Experience, Practical Christian life & How to handle fear? Mr. Isaac Peterson, Mrs. Angelin Isaac and Mrs. Priscilla Brighton shared and encouraged the missionary children. It was a great blessing.

Follow Up:

The follow up meeting of "Youth Encounter" was held on 26th January 2022. About 25 Mkids participated and shared their life challenges. Some expressed openly in the chat. This interaction motivated us, the Mkids volunteers, to spend a time of prayer on 6th February for these missionary children. In the meanwhile, we prepared a google form with a set of challenges to choose with yes/no/may be options and sent to all the missionary children who are in our whatsapp group. This is to focus our prayer specifically on the challenges they face.

Mkids Challenges:

We have received 71 responses from the mkids. The analysis was done by Isaac Peterson and displayed as a ppt to enable us to meaningfully pray for these children. Apart from financial assistance, mentoring, counselling and guidance are some of the areas they need our intervention. MUT volunteers continue to be in touch with these mkids and addressing their issues. Many Mkids are really blessed by this intervention. We were also able to assist few Mkids in placement through our known sources of contact. We continue to counsel in academic, spiritual and emotional aspects of these children.

Retreat in Telugu:

"Youth Encounter" retreat for Telugu speaking children is proposed to be held from March 17th to 19th through online. Plans are also underway to hold a physical retreat for Odiya speaking missionary children in a suitable place.

Financial Assistance:

We continue to provide financial assistance to Mkids higher education and for the marriage of 1st generation missionary children. In this financial year we have assisted about 80 Mkids for educational assistance and financial grant to 33 first generation missionary children's marriage as on date.

Future Activities:

We plan to hold a meeting to address "Love & Lust" for those who are studying and another meeting on "Pre-marital counselling" for those who are working. Also we plan to conduct aptitude assessment and career counseling for the 8th to 10th standard missionary children. Please pray for His guidance in every step.

Oddanchatram Retreat Center

Oddanchatram Campus was started with the sole purpose of meeting the unmet needs of the full time servants of God – to meet the - general health, mental & spiritual needs, to encourage them and enable them to be mighty witnesses.

Vision in a Nutshell:

- Vacation
- Master Health Check-up & Treatment
- Training as well as development
- Prayer and similar Spiritual Events
- Rest as well as rejuvenation.

Oddanchatram Campus serves in two fronts to fulfil the Vision of MUT – The First is Personal Development Programs (Training) conducted, here. The second is Rest House where “Servants of God” come to stay for Health Check-up, Treatment, Vacation, Rest as well as Rejuvenation.

Personal Development Programs– PD Programs [Training]

God’s servants face spiritual, psychological and physical stressors and in many cases, they are unable to receive the support they need due to several reasons. The stress study results revealed that these pressures lead some of the missionaries to break down, become inefficient in their work or develop problems in relationship. The training programs are organized at a subsidized cost for improving inter-personal relationships, enrichment of marriages, healing of emotional wounds, meditational programs for spiritual renewal and programs for team building.

We could not have any Personal Development Programs during this period due to covid restrictions. Had two programs in Feb`22.

Rest House& Medical

Medical - In spite of Pandemic restrictions, totally 50 Persons, stayed in our Rest House, during this period. Total number of days they stayed was 163 days. Rs. 8, 285/- was accepted as donations.

A break up tells us 2 came for MHC, 20 on other medical needs, 4 for Rest & Prayer, 5 for other needs.

They belonged to 17 different organizations [ANAND NIKETAN, BYM, CEFI, EHA, FMPB, GEMS, GILGAL, GM, ICGM, ICRM, IEM, NICL, SMILE ORG’S UCMSI, UESI, UMI and few Independents].

Campus & Maintenance

We thank and praise God for enabling us to open the centre after almost 2 years due to the pandemic. Many missionaries have already started using this facility for their medical stay since January 2022. Mrs. Rani Selvaraj, care giver left on 22nd Dec 2021 to her son's house at Vellore, after serving 7 years.

Through donor support and your prayers, we have been able to complete the following

- Staff quarters repair and painting was finished.
- JJR memorial work has been completed by God's grace; head stone with photograph has been placed with a small garden and pathway around the memorial. MUT Values and

faith statement placards will be placed for visitors to spend time thanking God for the vision and his obedience that has helped many missionaries

- A block (12 Rooms for missionaries who come for medical treatment) is being revamped. Damaged bathroom doors have been replaced. New curtains donated by friends have been hung.
- Lighting has been done for the outdoor dining area for lively dinners during programs.
- Meeting hall equipment have been serviced, new curtains and wall hangings have been donated
- A large fish tank with natural plants have been setup in the common dining – In memory of Mr/ JJ Ratnakumar
- 20 coconut trees have been planted; many trees have also been planted along the prayer walk
- Minor masonry repairs on the path way have been done.
- Chicken Coup repair & Maintenance work was carried out.
- We have many more maintenance expenses in the coming months. We request you to pray and support MUT Oddanchatram ministries.

Pondicherry Rest House

God enabled MUT supporters and volunteers to meet regularly for third Sunday prayer meeting. Rest House occupancy was restricted to 50% as per MUT guidelines. During these 4 months a total of 8 full time ministers of God utilized our rest house.

Home call: Pastor. Johny Eldho (Assembly of God) age 53 from Palakad passed away on 3rd Dec '21 due to sudden cardiac arrest. He was in treatment for heart & lungs problem in JIPMER hospital. He is survived by his wife Mrs. Seema & one daughter (10th std)

On 24.10.2021 a planning meeting was conducted for MUT Volunteers in Pondy for the purpose of purchasing a land & construction of Missionary Rest House in Pondy & to organize Music for Missions program. Around 18 volunteers participated in the planning meet. Music for Missions program was tentatively fixed for 12th March 2022, but due to the pandemic it is postponed to 4th June 2022. Pray for the efforts taken by MUT Pondy team in identifying a land for a Rest House.

On 06.11.2021, 12 hours (8 am to 8 pm) special fasting prayer was conducted in MUT Pondy Rest House. Praise be to God.

Vision Casting

The main purpose of this ministry is to motivate the churches to involve in member care and missionary care. We thank God the way God is blessing this ministry by mobilising prayers and bringing people to involve in missionary care.

A session for North Karnataka believers and Pastors was held on the 13th Nov '21 thru Zoom. About 30 Pastors and believers attended the meeting.

First time, on 15th Jan '22, we were able to connect to some US friends for a vision casting session thru Zoom. About 55 people connected and many heard for the first time about MUT. Bro John Daniel presented about MUT. A Q&A session was done also. Bro Binod Maliel led the session of the Next steps with a word shared by Mrs. Annie Malcolm. Bro Rajan Abraham brought greetings and helped put the program together. Rev Johnson Raju, Pastor and Bro Elango prayed during the program. The vision of MUT is being shared and request your prayers that those who heard the vision will start involving in the days ahead. Thank God that there was unexpected support from lot of

pastors and others. Pray for the core team here and many good things to come out from them. The Indian missionaries and other God's servants will be blessed. Thank God for Bro Sam Nelson, US representative and other US friends who helped in organising this Vision Casting.

A set of PPT slides about MUT activities with photos was developed by Bro Jey Ratnakumar to do vision casting effectively. We have started to use it for all Vision Casting sessions. A system to track those who come for such meetings for easy follow up was also developed by Bro Binod Maliel. We have started to use this to keep and trace the individuals who are attending our sessions.

We plan for more Vision Casting sessions in places like Bangalore, Chennai, Trivandrum, Trichy, Pondy, Neyveli, Pune, Nagercoil and other US regions/places.

Thank God for each of the core committee team members, volunteers and partners who made these meetings possible.

Health Care

Providing Medical assistance to missionaries has been as one of the objectives from the very inception of MUT. From 2001 the Medical assistance scheme was started to meet the vital unmet need of missionaries as they faced with physical challenges in their course of life journey. The same is done through the following interventions.

Master Health Check-Up (MHC): Being aware of the health challenges at an early age helps to maintain the body fit and healthy. The purpose of this check-up is to help missionaries to identify their issues. This helps them to be in the best of health to serve the Lord in the best possible way.

From October'21 to January'22, only 13 missionaries from 5 organisations underwent the same in different hospitals.

Some of the missions are interested and planned to do the same but due to the pandemic situation unable to do the MHC. Once the pandemic gets over MUT wants to see that every missionary will have MHC done at the earliest. Few missions and missionaries are in the procession.

Affordable Cost Medicine: The same was provided to 84 missionaries from 30 Organisations with medicines for Diabetics, hypertension, & Cholesterol.

Medical Financial Assistance: From October'21 to January'22, medical financial assistance provided to 437 Missionaries from 84 Organisations.

Chronic Health Care: Chronic diseases like diabetes, hypertension and high cholesterol are a major health concern among missionaries as this leads to significant morbidity and mortality when not managed properly. With this in mind a survey of missionaries suffering from chronic diseases has been undertaken by MUT since last year.

A questionnaire is sent to all missions to respond with data regarding their missionaries with chronic diseases. Though persistent follow-up done only 41 out of 156 organisations responded to the questionnaire sent. Out of 41 missions, 12 organizations have given their details completely which were scrutinized by the volunteer doctor and followed up with Affordable Cost Medicines (Generic drugs) provision.

Medical Admin Committee Meeting: The same was held on 22nd January'22 through zoom platform in order to review how we can serve the missionaries still better. Mission leaders and doctors attended the same.

Pre-Retirement Orientation: MUT's Future Retirees

MUT, an umbrella body, for member care is being brought into the frame work of an organization and the organizational policy for retirement was finalized. Preparing the care givers to finish well was taken to heart and five caregivers who were nearing retirement were invited for a one day program for orientation, on the 21st of November, 2021. They were encouraged to think about retirement as the beginning of another phase of life, accept it and move ahead. Some Biblical aspects on retirement were brought out by Mr. Daniel Rajkumar Wellington (MUT Volunteer) and Bro. Jeyaraj, Retired BYM leader encouraged them to leave a legacy by training and equipping their successors to do the work and finish well. The General Coordinator Mr. John Daniel and

the Associate GC – Mr V D S Chandrasekar encouraged them to finish well and retire happily. Future options to be active were suggested by Mrs Juno Sudhaker who highlighted the challenges faced by the present retired persons. The promise verse brought out in all the talks was from Jeremiah 29:11 – God knows the plans that HE has for you... and Isaiah 46:4 - I will carry you in your old age... They were made to think about and accept the retirement phase, with the assurance that MUT will be with them and support them as they move on.

The program ended in a happy note, with the retirees starting to think and plan their retired life...

Lamtapat Rest House Project

This project is being implemented in Lamtaput, Koraput Dt. South Eastern Region, Odisha. It is a small village with a population of 60,000. The Aim of Missionary Upholders Trust is to meet the “Common Unmet needs of Missionaries” since our motto is to meet the ‘felt needs of the concerned missionaries’ not just the needs perceived by others.

Purpose of Lamtaput Project: At Lamtaput in Odisha there is a fifty bedded mission hospital, established in the early 1990s and it is called Asha Kiran Mission Hospital, ‘Asha (Hope) Kiran (life)’ There is also a Missionary School by name Anand Niketan [fully residential] where 100 plus missionary children are studying and frequently missionaries arrive either to take treatment from the hospital or visit their children studying in the school. Hence there is a felt need of a Rest House cum Retreat Centre at Lamtaput. MUT would like to develop a Rest house cum

Retreat Centre here outside of Tamil Nadu for the missionaries and full time workers in the same model of Oddanchatram MUT centre to conduct Personal Development Programs for missionaries and pastors in the Eastern side of India, covering the states of Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal and North Eastern states and provide Rest House facilities at an affordable cost.

In the year 2007 and 2010 God provided two pieces of land in Lamtaput [adjacent to one another] as a gift to MUT. There is a good scope for developing this land into a Rest House cum a Retreat Centre which would cater to the needs of Missionaries and Pastors coming for treatment at Asha Kiran Hospital and the parents who come to meet their children in Anand Niketan School. In view of the Needs of Missionaries and with the support of Asha Kiran Hospital, Anand Niketan, Friends of MUT [FOM]

and Odisha Tamil Missionary [OTM] and in consultation with member missions of MUT, we have decided prayerfully to initiate action on this Project of building a Rest House cum Retreat Centre. We have strongly felt that God is leading us to venture by faith in this project for the blessing of Missionaries and Churches in Lamtaput vicinity.

The decision was made in the MUT Board and preparations were started in January 2021. God provided Mr. Israel Gnanaraj, Director DESIGN COLLABORATIVE, Pondicherry for architectural and engineering support.

To obtain the necessary clearance from the local authorities was unduly delayed due to the pandemic and God made everything possible by November 2021. Then in 1st week of December Mr. John Daniel and Mr. VDS Chandrasekar visited Lamtaput (Pics: 1 & 2) and met the FOMs and the local Missions and held discussions. They fixed a Labour contractor and the local executive team consists of Dr. Mathews Chacko, Mr. Herold Rajan, Mrs. Jamuna Rajan, Mr. Ranjan, Mr. Shaji. God provided a site engineer in January 2022 from Tuni EGF, A.P. With the team the work was started by the end of December 2021. Since we have to start from screech, the following things have been done so far:

1. A culvert to get into the Land (Pic: 3)
2. To clear up the existing bore well and to draw water (Pic: 4)
3. A shed to keep the materials & the site engineer to stay (Pic: 5)
4. Laid foundation for the Staff Quarters and Rest House

Since the Electricity is a challenge, we have to put up a transformer to draw electricity from the main high tension wire. For the time being we have got a generator from AKS and using that to draw water. The present existing bore well does not have much water. We have to go for a new deeper bore well in near future.

The Odisha Tamil Missionary South Zone fellowship visited the site and arranged a prayer walk and fellowship meeting on 22nd January, Saturday from 10 am to 3pm. They contributed their free will offering to RH Project. (Pic: 6)

About 40 missionaries from Asha Kiran, Anand Niketan and IEM participated in the Thanks giving cum laying foundation prayer on 5th March from 5 to 7 pm. Mrs. Hannah Alex from Oddanchatram laid the foundation and encouraged them through the Word.(Pic: 7)

We anticipate the missionaries, pastors and Christian workers from the Eastern States of India to be rejuvenated in mind, body, and spirit as they come to the Rest house to relax with their families, receive health care, and also be revived through the spiritual inputs received from the Personal Development programs. We may need some more money for the non-anticipated expenses. We believe the “Jehovah Jireh” shall provide the remaining resources. Kindly pray and support this project.



Retired Missionaries Welfare

It is a joy to interact with the retired missionaries as they have loads of experience in the Lord's vineyard and can share so much on how the Lord worked through them and in them. The burden swells within that they should be cared for as they have sacrificially given their whole lives to the Lord. While the primary member care is to be given by the mission organizations, the Church and the believers have an equal responsibility in caring for them in the physical, emotional, mental and spiritual areas. Children's role in taking care of their aged parents is the most satisfying care that one can receive as parents.

MUT, being a member care organization, partners with the missions in meeting some of the common unmet needs, in all the four areas, with a core committee and a RM Welfare Admin Committee with 6 Mission leaders, 4 retired missionaries and 6 MUT leaders. God provides all the needed funds through His children, who donate their mite for this cause, thereby assuring that HE cares for HIS servants, more than us. As on 31st December there are 832 RMs from 68 missions. The number is on the rise and so are their needs. More member care volunteers are also needed.

In the last 4 months from October 2021 to January 2022, God enabled the RMW team of MUT to provide the following care:

- i Medical Assistance** against applications received with bills: 13 RMs of 10 missions assisted up to Rs. 3.11 lakh for Major medical problems like Cancer, Heart and uncontrolled Diabetes. 53 RMs assisted up to Rs.2.56 lakh for minor hospitalizations, Cataract surgery and Regular Medicines. Apart from this donors have passed on donations earmarked to sick RMs, which has been a great help above the max cap provided by MUT.
- ii MARM:** Medical Annual Assistance @ Rs.2000/- was passed to 97 RMs (75 years and above) (Yet to pay: Age 65 -74 yrs @ Rs.2000/- per family to 300 families)

iii Affordable Cost Medicines: 12 RMs of 7 missions were supplied with generic medicines.

iv Home Calls: 11 RMs completed their earthly race and have gone home to receive their crown of life. Remember to pray for the dear ones, they have left behind. Funeral assistance of Rs.10,000/- is being passed on to the bereaved spouses, from donations.

v Retreats through Zoom: RM Regional Fellowship Meets (RMRFM) were held on the 5th, 7th, 12th & 14th of October, in Hindi, Oriya, Telugu and English (Kerala & Karnataka) in the respective languages. 255 RMs were contacted and 155 attended the same. Worship, spiritual insights and Health Tips by Doctors were given in their regional languages. **Outcome:** Fellowship, seeing each other and the messages revived them. Prayer groups were formed.

vi Medical Instruments (Thermometer, BP apparatus, Glucometer & Hot Water Bag): While talking to more than 550 RMs, during the Lock Down period, it was observed that many were unable to go to the clinics for their BP & Diabetes checking. The need for simple apparatus at home was felt and a survey was taken. In January '22, 409 RMs were supplied with whatever was needed by them. All praises to God for His provision of nearly Rs.10.00 lakh for the purchase of Instruments, packing and dispatch of the same pan India. Our heartfelt thanks to the donors whose hearts were stirred to bless the retired missionaries and to the missions and volunteers who helped in personal distribution at Chennai, Vellore, Hyderabad, Tirunelveli and Madurai.

We praise God for His provisions through you. Please continue to uphold their needs, the ones who lost their spouses, those who are very sick and those who have children who are not yet settled. Thank God for the partnership with CCM in meeting with the additional medical expenses, which bridges the gap, to some extent. All Glory and Honour to God and God alone.

The MUT Tirunelveli Team had wonderfully organised the program and also hosted the choristers and the guests that included volunteers from Sivakasi. Missionary Upholders Family

MUF was formed in 1984, mainly to challenge and encourage Christian families to involve in missions by raising financial support and prayer for missionaries. There are over 1,400 missionary upholders families (MUF) who meet regularly for prayers and also support 470 missionaries from various mission organizations. 100 volunteers of MUF along with the missionaries of various mission organizations raise money for the medical assistance of member missionaries of MUT. There

are several local units at Thirumangalam, Dindigul, Madurai, Oddanchatram, Pondy, Neyveli, Trichy, Vellore, Bangalore, Chennai, Tirunelveli, Palayamkottai etc. where the contributions are collected and sent to missionaries/missions.

There are two meetings conducted to decentralize the MUF collections in Madurai. Pray for effective ways that would be planned and many local volunteers to be raised.

Missionary Upholders Trust (MUT)

MUT was a spin off from MUF (Missionaries Upholder Family) in the year 1993. The role of MUT is to care for missionaries by meeting some of the common unmet needs at a cost affordable to them in physical, emotional and spiritual areas, with a view to equip, energize and to motivate them, to build the kingdom of God effectively.

MUT is an umbrella body covering over 260 Organizations as member missions covering about 23,100 missionaries and Christian workers. MUT is governed by a Board of Trustees and managed by the General Coordinator assisted mostly by over 60

volunteers; recently some of the Member

Missions have taken keen interest in the ministry and are giving their committed workers on deputation for a period from 6 months to 2 years. There are over 37 people on MUT payroll, receiving monthly remuneration. The operational costs and administrative expenses are kept low through sponsorship and donations towards administrative expenses. MUT does not append any money from any of its earmarked donations received.

Finance Policy
